

CLEGG TO DELIVER CHANGE

Britain is set for real change with the Lib Dems in power for the first time in decades.

The rise of the Lib Dems made the General Election the most exciting in a generation. Nearly seven million people voted for Nick Clegg's party.

Lib Dem Lynne Beaumont has thanked voters across Folkestone and Hythe for their support in the General Election. She congratulated new MP Damian Collins for winning the seat. Lynne also thanked all the Council staff who had worked on the election and the count itself.

The Lib Dem vote was increased by over 1,500 since 2005, whilst the Conservatives saw their majority reduced by around 2,000 from the "notional majority". Labour saw their vote reduced to under

11%. The full result was:

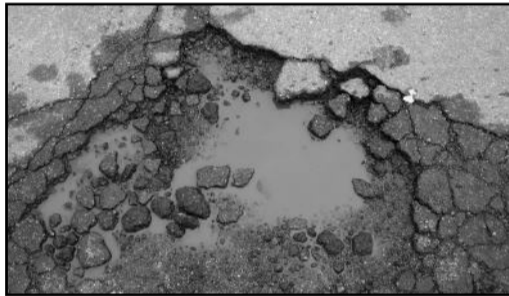

Folkestone West Potholes: Over 50 roads affected

County Councillor Tim Prater has received notification of pothole repairs across Cheriton, Morehall and Sandgate. Not believing there were just 33 roads requiring work he inspected the area himself. After a quick drive around Tim found another 22 in serious need of repair.

"We should have much stronger local control, proper use of local contractors and frankly more repairs being done, quicker."

Tim said: "When there are over 50 roads across the area with serious potholes in them, it's clear that the maintenance system itself is failing to keep on top of the work. The
